

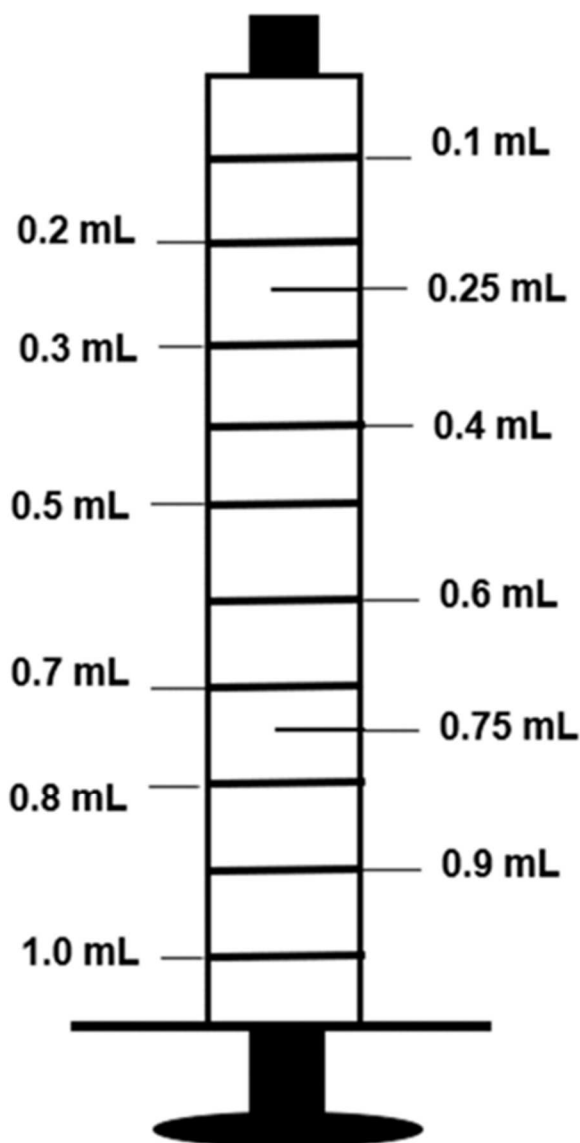
Haloperidol (Haldol) Oral Concentrate (2mg/mL)

Most Common Uses: Agitation, Hallucinations, Nausea, Restlessness

Some Common Side Effects: Dizziness, Drowsiness, Dry Mouth

What is the difference between milligrams (mg) and milliliters (mL)?

A medication is ordered in milligrams (mg) but as a liquid it is measured in milliliters (mL). For a solution with a concentration of 2mg/mL: 1mL= 2 mg, 0.75mL=1.5 mg, 0.5 mL= 1 mg, and 0.25 mL= 0.5 mg.
